Thanks for your info. It confuses me a bit. I have a record from Evergreen Cemetery in Washington Cty of a Eugene Lowell Inmam, age 11m6d, son of Susie & Eugene, born in Salem, died in Salem. Then I have the records from the Argyle Town Historian, that has Ruth E. Burgess & Eugene Inman being married on 6/2/1877. They have 4 children, 3 living and then you have Ruth in 1900 without Eugene. Could Susie have been 1st wife? No record of death. Ruth 2nd wife? No record of death. I have a male child, 2nd child-2nd living born on the date that my gfather gave as his bday, 12/30/1881. Still no record of him until his marriage in 1910 to Ida in Niskayuna. Birth record for the 2nd child states that Ruth was 33 and born in Argyle. Do they have birth records for 1848 in Argyle?

I have access to all the census online through Ancestry.com.

I see Eugene Inman in the 1880 census of Argyle, Washington Co., NY. He is 38, born VT, parents born VT. Ruth E. is 20, born NY, parents born NY. Earl N. is 2, Carrie M. is 4 months (born in Feb). It would make sense that Edward would have been born in 1882...

In 1900, Ruth E. Inman, 40, is listed as a servant/tenant in the William Montgomery family in Salem, Washington Co.. Ruth is the mother of 4 children, 3 are living. Eugene is probably deceased. I can't find Edward anywhere! (He may have been in orphanage then, though he would be about 18 y.o.

In 1910, Edward age 26 and Ida age 28 are in Niskayuna, married for 6 yrs. Bertha Oldenhouse, age 12 boards with them.

I would look for cemetery records in Washington Co. for Eugene's death etc.

My ancestors were buried at St. Peters cemetery in Troy. My great grandmother -- Mary Keefe Langton grew up at 83 10th Street which I assume was part of St. Peters parish....not sure though.

She was married at a church called -- St. Paul the Apostle. I assume that St. Paul's branched out from St. Peters. I called the cemetery last year and they gave me a bunch of dates and burials over the phone. I visited Troy for the first time to take my daughter to see RPI. I had hoped to find the church and cemetery but we had no time to tour the city and it was raining.

I would also be interested in seeing St. Peters records. I believe that my Troy Ancestors -- Langton-Keefe lived in the same location for about 100 years -- 1850 through 1940s. I did have a chance to look for their address

83 10th Street but there were only 2 houses on the street and the rest was a parking lot. It was right on the edge of the RPI Campus so I assume the house had been torn down at some point to be used by the campus.

In a posting to the TIGS list on September 6, 2005, a major new project of automating the Rensselaer County marriage index was announced and a request was made for volunteers to do transcribing of data.

List members may be interested in the following status report on the marriage index project.

1. After a slow start with a balky laptop computer, webmaster Jeanne Keefe volunteered her new laptop along with a scanner and the scanning of the index was finally begun. In one scanning session, all of the marriage index data for the letters A., B. and C. were scanned and converted into 56 pdf files. Keep in mind how this index is set up, there are separate pages showing ONLY the brides names and separate pages showing ONLY the groom's names.

2. To date, 23 individuals from all over the country and Canada have volunteered to work on this new project. Volunteers are from the following locations:

- Iowa
- Canada
- North Carolina
- South Carolina
- Georgia
- Pennsylvania - 2
- Ohio
- Arkansas
- Massachusetts - 3
- California
- Maryland
- New York State - 9

3. Volunteers were emailed an excel spread sheet and a pdf file of the scanned data to be entered into the excel spread sheet. Over 90% of all the files have been completed and returned by the transcribers AND the returned work has already been proofread.

4. The Rensselaer County Marriage Index is contained in 10 Volumes. Volume 1, which is what we are presently working on, has 5,000 records which translates into 10,000 names. As each Volume is completed it will be posted to the TIGS website. It was recently mentioned on the TIGS list that these marriage index records have been microfilmed by the Latter Day Saints and can be ordered for a fee for viewing at local Family History Centers. While this is true, TIGS plans for portraying the data on our website far exceeds what is available from the microfilm record. First of all, the names on the microfilm are not in strict alphabetical order AND you would have to look through 10 separate files of data. Then when you find a name on the microfilm that you may be interested in, there is no mention of the spouse. Remember as mentioned before, the index has separate pages by letters of the alphabet for the bride's names and separate pages for the groom's names and there is NO cross reference to the spouse.

5. When the marriage index data is formatted by TIGS members, we will be linking the bride and grooms names TOGETHER on one line of data by using the marriage record number and all

records will be in strict alphabetical order.. For example, these two actual records are taken from Volume 3 of the index:

6. In a second meeting with Frank Merola, Rensselaer County Clerk, on October 13, 2005, Mr. Merola was briefed on the progress of the TIGS marriage index project. Our plans for putting the marriage index on the TIGS website was again discussed and approved in this meeting and it was stated again that TIGS will provide the County Clerk's Office with a cd copy of all data. Mr. Merola has viewed the current TIGS website and is very impressed with it. He was also amazed that we have so many volunteers from all over the country. He is very appreciative of the work we are doing especially in our plans for linking the bride and grooms names together.

Our next step in the project is to have another scanning session at the County Clerk's Office. The process works well with three people, one to operate the laptop computer and two to maneuver the large and heavy books on the scanner. Daughter: Catherine Gaynor - Born in New York abt 1843

The family moved to Milwaukee, WI sometime between 1843 and 1850.

This data was taken from the 1850 and 1860 census in Milwaukee, WI so the dates might not be accurate.

Thomas was in the Civil War Company F of the 24th Infantry from Milwaukee, WI. Mustered-in in August of 1862 and was listed as "deserted" 12/31/1862. The Civil War records show that he was born in Troy, New York.

This family was Roman Catholic and I believe that St. Peters Church was the only Roman Catholic church in that era.

So far I have contacted St. Peters Church and the administrative assistant, Denise Mahoney, found what might be the birth and baptism for Thomas.

Here is what she found:

I have a James GAINER & Anna Egan as parents of three baptized children at St. Peter's. GAYNOR (I think it's the same name just spelled different)

1st child: John Gainer born 9/5/1830 baptized 9/13/1830 2nd child: Bridget Gainer born 10/22/1832 baptized 10/29/1832
3rd child: Thomas Gainer born 10/19/1838 baptized 11/11/1838

Still have some loose ends. I need a good copy of the 1840 census. The records at Ancestry.com have several pages that cannot be viewed. I also need to check the Troy newspapers for birth announcements. Are these reliable for that era? Anyone have a Surname index for that era?

I am living in the Milwaukee, WI area and am helping my wife Mary Pat do the research of her ancestors.

Joan Howe from Iowa has the current Picture of the Month on the TIGS website. In her description of the picture she mentions she didn't know the name of the railroad her relative worked for.

The following information may offer a clue.

The obituary for my great uncle, James J. Dwyer (1880-1934), a former supervisor from the Sixth Ward, mentions that for many years he was a telegraph operator at the Iron Works Station of the Troy-Union Railroad.

The 1920 census, when he lived at 747 Burden Avenue, South Troy, lists him as a telegrapher for a steam railroad. In the 1930 census, while he was still at 749 Burden Avenue, he is shown as a ticket agent for a steam railroad.

Some other interesting items:

1. James was married to Nora Catherine O'Connor (1882-1957), long active in the Troy AOH, and a sister to my grandfather William O'Connor (1880-1941).
2. 749 Burden Avenue today is a parking lot for Marty Burke's South End Tavern.
3. At some point in his railroad career, James lost both legs in a railroad accident. I have yet to find the newspaper story on that accident.
4. After his accident, James worked as a ticket agent at the railroad office in Schenectady.

Just wonder whether you might have seen the name of my great uncle, WILLIAM MARTIN REYNOLDS ? He was a mechanic and engineer, but I don't know for what railroad. He was born in Ireland and came here at about 8 yrs. of age with his family in 1882. They lived in Green Island until about the 1890's. We have his date of death in 1901 and his death certificate, but have yet to find any mention in newspaper microfilm .

Wonder whether there are any railroad records , payroll, etc., anywhere for viewing. We've never seen a picture of him or any of his family, outside of his brother, my grandfather, James Reynolds. The only picture I've ever heard of, in fact, is of my great grandfather, (William and James' father,) JOHN REYNOLDS.

He is seated between 2 big dogs, in front of a house with what is described as gingerbread trim.

There was another brother, JOHN, who married Mary Ann(e) O'Reiley(?) in 1900. She was the only child of Patrick and Alice, both from Ireland. John ran a bar/pub on 3rd in Watervliet around the early 1900's ,but was also a carpenter.

In addition to Bill McGrath's posting about his great-uncle's position at the Troy-Union Railroad, yesterday I received the following information from Gordon Davids of Severna Park, MD. I have his permission to post it to Troy Irish Genealogy Society:

<start>I can tell you a few things about railroads around Troy, having spent four years at RPI and later working for the New York Central and the Delaware and Hudson.

The railroad at South Troy was the New York Central. They had a freight house there, where they loaded and unloaded "L.C.L." (Less than Carload) freight, or small shipments. The men in the photo seem to be a few of the clerks, maybe the agent (the guy in charge) and mostly freight handlers or truckers (push trucks, from the car to the dock to the freight house.) Before motor trucks, most freight, even small shipments, moved that way from factories to wholesalers to stores. That many men would have been needed at the Troy Freight House.

The truckers moved the boxes to and from the cars, and the clerks, or "checkers" made sure that the stuff went into the right cars and that the shipping documents, "way bills," accompanied each shipment.

The New York Central also interchanged LCL freight with the Delaware and Hudson and the Boston and Maine Railroads at Troy. I don't know exactly what the routes for "house cars" (LCL freight) were, but it would have been very likely that the NYC loaded at least one car each day at Troy with interchange for the B&M and for the D&H.

The New York Central came into Troy from both Rensselaer and Schenectady. The Delaware and Hudson came across the river from Green Island (where they had their Troy Freight House) and the Boston and Maine came in from Johnsonville. The New York Central's Troy and Schenectady Branch operated on the D&H from Green Island to Troy. The B&M freight house was in their yard between Hoosick Street and Middleburgh Street. They all joined in the Troy Union Railroad, which branched off from the New York Central at Madison Street and ran north to Hoosick Street, and west from Federal Street to the Green Island Bridge west of River Street. The Troy Passenger Station was owned by the TURR, which was in turn owned by the NYC (50%), D&H (25%) and B&M(25%).

The New York Central freight yard extended generally from Republic Steel north past Madison Street to around Second Street, close to the river. The Troy Union Railroad turned inland (east) at Madison Street, and ran generally between Sixth Street and the foot of the hill. It ran through a tunnel under Congress Street, and the station was between Broadway and Fulton Street. I think I got that right, off the top of my head from 42 years ago.

I suspect that the LCL freight business at Troy was fairly busy in the early 1900's, with such industries as Cluett, Peabody and Rail Joint Company shipping, and nearly all the stores in Troy receiving freight every day. <end>

Yes, Donna, it WAS Wendy!

We got married on October 9.

We were married in Cambridge NY, at the Coila Church where the first McAlonie- John McAlonan- was married in 1830. The girl he married was named Anna Miller, and her father's and grandfather's families were listed among the church's founding pioneer families in the 1780s.

The day the before the wedding, in a nice Irish downpour, our families and our minister placed a wreath and prayed at the old Miller graves in the Old Turnpike Graveyard in remembrance of the old Celtic custom of Garland Sunday, which is usually the first Sunday in September where the unmarried women in the family make a wreath of twigs and flowers and place it on their ancestors graves. It was great, my family had no choice but to put up with my genealogy all weekend! And I think they actually enjoyed it.

We were going to take wedding pictures at the old Miller farm in Jackson at the 1830s farmhouse that is still there, but the sunlight did not cooperate.

If you are researching relatives with a TROY, NY area connection, you will be interested in this new on-line, name searchable, data base of over 700 names of Troy Area residents who died in 1901-1902. This information was extracted from Troy City Directories and information covers not only Troy but also data from the Watervliet/Green Island and Cohoes/Waterford sections of the City Directory.

Anyone who has ever used City Directories as a genealogy research tool appreciates the wealth of information available in these books. Starting with the 1902 Troy City Directory, this data base was a first step by the Troy Irish Genealogy Society to capture this information and portray it in a name searchable format that could be used by researchers who do not have access to Troy City Directories.

It should be noted that these records, like all the TIGS data bases, cover the general population in the area and are NOT restricted to Irish surnames. The information in this data base may include, in addition to the name of the individual:

Date of death.
Name of surviving spouse.
Name of deceased spouse.
Occupation of deceased and name of employer.
Street address and city of residence of deceased.

As time permits, data in subsequent years of the City Directories will be added to the on-line records on the TIGS website.
