Just wanted to say thank you for posting ...in advance... that there would be free access to the Origins site for the brief period (July 4/5).

My sister and I were in Ireland for a couple of weeks last month, and in our excitement, neglected to search BACKWARDS from our great grandfather and get copies of the information in the canceled land books at the Valuation Office. (Actually, looked back, but never ordered the copies.) At any rate, we bought copies of what we knew to be family information and the section of the beautiful, old map showing the area of their 21 acres in Moher, just south of Ballinasloe in County Galway. Further, when we arrived in Galway a few days later, we were able, with help, to find the land and the man who now owns it, and from our conversation, were directed to the remains of the house where JOHN REYNOLDS had lived...with 1st wife MARGARET MOONEY and children Michael and Maria (Mary) Reynolds, and then with our great grandmother JANE ANDERSON and their sons William Martin, John Joseph, and Patrick Reynolds. NO words to describe what that visit meant to us.

Although the Originsnetwork site didn't show the handwritten pages that we were able to see in the old books at the Valuation Office, I was at least able to "go back" to the primary valuation information in the original format, on line, and print copies, for which I am appreciative... That became important because our great great grandfather, MARTIN REYNOLDS married a HONORA POWELL. His son, great grand-father John, "took over" the land from a DANIEL POWELL... and JOHN POWELL is the name on the primary valuation for that same land so...another lesson learned and maybe a couple more generations picked up in the process. As I am researching O'Connor's in Troy, NY and Nenagh, County Tipperary, Ireland and McCormick's in Troy, NY and Dunbin, County Louth, Ireland, I wanted to share the following informaton I received from the Rensselaer County Clerk's Office.

On June 21, I sent a request to the Rensselaer County Clerk's Office for copies of the marriage papers for one of the records I found on the new 10,000 name Rensselaer County Marriage Index on the Troy Irish Genealogy Website: http://www.rootsweb.com/~nytigs/

On June 27, I received the marriage papers in the mail.

While I already knew the names of the bride and groom, DAVID DUFTYand JULIA O'CONNOR, I now know the following additional bits of information from these marriage documents:

- 1. David Dufty, was 34 years of age, born in England and this was his first marriage.
- 2. Julia O'Connor was 31 years of age, born in Troy and this was her first marriage.
- 3. David was a moulder.
- 4. Julia was a laundry worker.
- 5. Parents of David were David Dufty and Betsey Davis, both born in England.
- 6. Parents of Julia were Timothy O'Connor and Catherine McCormick, both born in Ireland.
- 7. Witnesses were Thomas G. McNamara and Elizabeth McNamara.
- 8. Wedding was February 12, 1911 at St. Michael's Church, Troy, NY.
- 9. Priest's name looks like Patrick B. Dempsey.

On top of all the above information, you get to see the actual signatures of all the parties involved. It was well worth the \$5.00 to get copies of these marriage records and the response time from the County Clerk's Office is fantastic.

Note: From prior research I know that the parents of Catherine McCormick O'Connor were Patrick McCormick and Catherine Gaskin and the parents of Timothy O'Connor were William O'Connor and Catherine Gleason.

A partnership between Rensselaer County Clerk Frank J. Merola and members of the Troy Irish Genealogy Society (TIGS) has resulted in the automation of over 5,000 marriage records in Rensselaer County beginning in 1908. When complete, over 30,000 Rensselaer County marriages between 1908 and 1935 will be automated and available for searching through the Genealogy society's website.

"I am very pleased to be involved in this partnership with a great organization that is willing to take the time and effort necessary to open our historical records through the use of the internet which will allow those interested to search these records from their home or office rather than in taking a trip into Troy to examine these books," Mr. Merola said, "I am very grateful to TIGS president Donna Vaughn, project coordinator Bill McGrath, webmaster/librarian Jeanne Keefe, and the rest of the members of the Troy Irish Genealogy Society who contributed the time and effort necessary to complete this large project. TIGS volunteers from around the US worked to convert the original marriage index records to digital files which made them accessible through the Internet."

Anyone interested in viewing the first index of marriage records is encouraged to go to the Troy Irish Genealogy Society website at www.rootsweb.com/~nytigs/ and click on 'TIGS PROJECTS and then Rensselaer County Marriage Index, Vol. 1. These records cover the general area population and are not restricted to Irish surnames. The website also provides a printable form that can be used to request copies of the Affidavit for License to Marry, the Certificate and Record of Marriage and in the case of minors, the Certificate of Consent from the Rensselaer County Clerk's office. The Rensselaer County Clerk's office charges a \$5.00 fee for retrieval services of these marriage records. The marriage forms provided by the County Clerk's Office, Mr. Merola stated, will be of great interest to family researchers. Some items of interest on the forms, Merola indicated, are the ages, addresses, occupations and place of birth of the bride and groom as well as the names and place of both of the parents.

Mr. Merola anticipates a continuation of this project until the ten volume Marriage Index has been completed and foresees future collaboration with the Troy Irish Genealogy Society that will benefit Rensselaer County residents and historians alike.

"Preservation of our records has always been a priority of mine because our heritage is irreplaceable. We have made tremendous progress in restoring County naturalization records and with the help of organizations such as the Irish Genealogy Society we will not only be able to preserve our records but develop a format where people can utilize modern methods to search their histories. I am thrilled to partner with this great organization and I am thrilled about the future of genealogy in Rensselaer County.

He somehow ended up in the Alabama Confederate Army and was taken prisoner in April, 1865 in Virginia. Both Morris and Mary are buried in St Joseph's Cemetery in Troy.

I have not done any more investigation into the Martin family. Please advise if this is any connection to your Margaret Martin.

Oliver Browne est. b. 1770, Diocese of Cashel & Emly married 1795/96 to (Mary) Sarah Grant. They had at least 4 sons; I've found 2: John Browne b. 1798 and Cooper Crawford Browne b. 1 Apr 1804.

Cooper married 1826 to Deborah Owens in Tipperary. Their living children: Eliza Jane, Mary, Charles Broderick, and possibly Richard D. Cooper took Deborah, Mary and Charles to NY in 1852. Eliza Jane was already in NY at that time; possibly John (Cooper's older brother) and possibly Richard, too.

Mary married Charles Sullivan Davis about 1854, and raised their children in Troy/Green Island area.

One daughter, Mary Ellen b. 1862, married 14 Sep 1881 to George Edgar Gardner b. 1858. They had 6 living children all born in Green Island: Edgar Alvin, Elizabeth Susan, Achibald Winfield, Blanche (Mittie), Ethel May, Charles Waldo, Mary Ruth, Elsie Grace, and Margaret Davis.

Elsie, b. 1899 married 26 Nov 1919 to Ralph Emerson Saner b. 1887 in Powhatan Point, OH. They probably met when Ralph was in the Army, stationed at Watervleit Arsenal, NY. Ralph took Elsie back to his home town where they had two children: Donald Emerson Saner and Miriam Saner. After Ralph's death, abt. 1930/32, Elsie returned to NY with Donald and Miriam. From 1934-1970's, they are in Troy, many years at 112th St.

Elsie joined her sister Blanche in the 1940's running a dance studio. Blanche was the business manager; Elsie taught ballroom dancing. I believe the studio's name was La Salle or La Sahn. When Miriam became older, she taught ballet, tap, and later, baton. She took her baton students to participate in many parades throughout the state.

Donald married Joyce, an Australian war bride; they traveled as Don remained in the US Navy until 1967.

Miriam married James Foley around 1950, and lived in Troy until abt. 1970 when she moved to Arizona with her daughter, Nadene.
