ALEXANDER G. CUNNINGHAM was born in Quebec May 2, 1855. His parents were Donald and Ellen Cunningham. When in his fourth year he was taken with his family to Montreal, where he lived six years. The past twenty-three years Mr. Cunningham has resided in Troy. After attending the Christian Brothers' Academy for several years he entered the employ of William Collins, sash and blind manufacturer, and remained with him as salesman until Mr. Collins sold out to Mann & Dater. On April 5, 1886, Mr. Cunningham formed a copartnership with J. L. Young, James R. Walsh and James T. Young, and the firm, under the name of Cunningham, Young & Co., have since been engaged in the manufacture of doors and blinds. They have a very large factory in West Troy. In 1879 and '80 Mr. Cunningham was vice-president of the Y. M. C. L. A. He is a member of the Edward Murphy, Jr., Association, the Y. M. C. L. A., the Robert Emmet Association and the Citizens' Corps. He was married Jan. 20, 1881, to Miss Mary A. Tracey.
